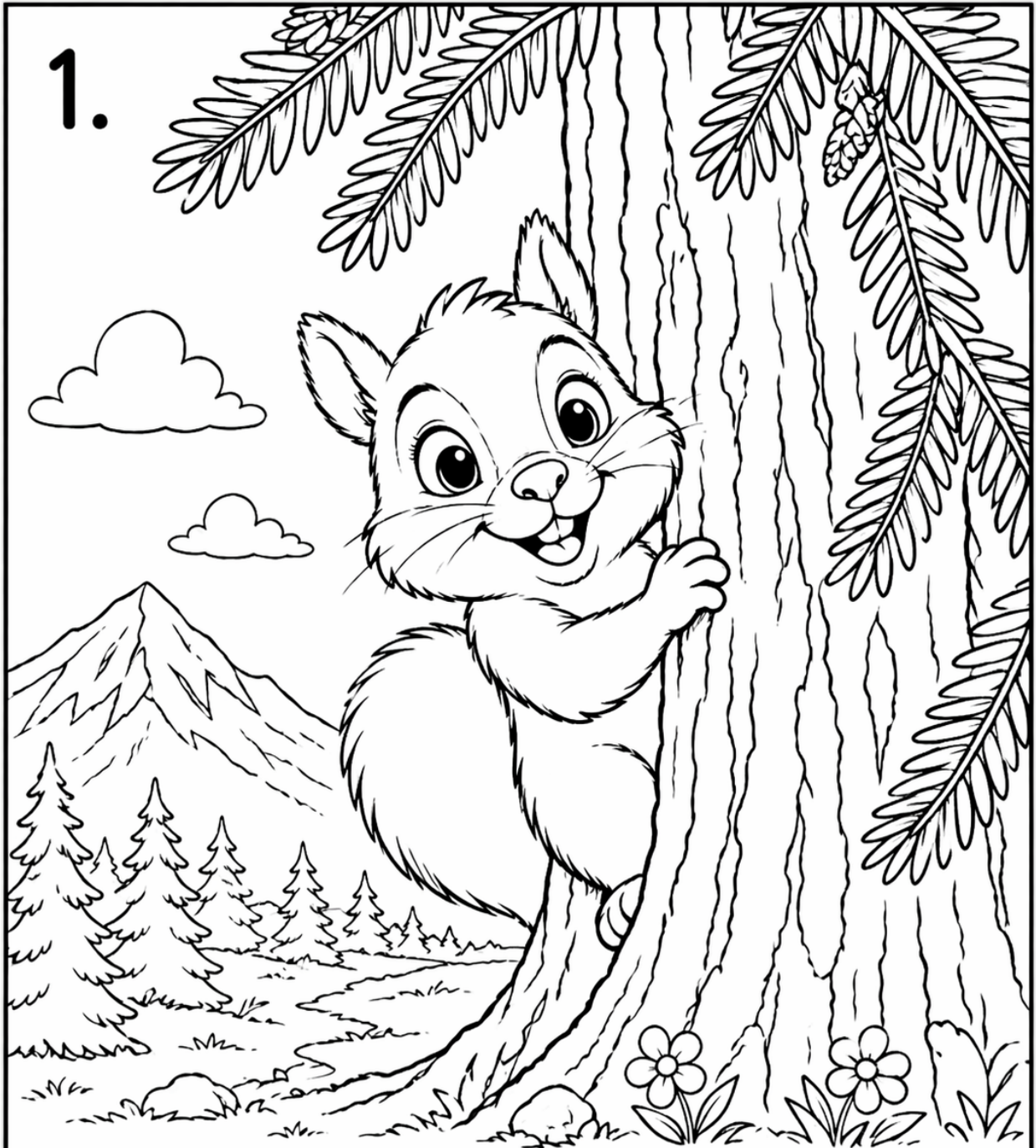


"I just LOVE winter,"
